



The NEW Cherry Hinton Hub/ Library Extension including a Community Cafe



Cherry Hinton Residents Association have been working with the City and County Councils to bring about an extension to the Library which will, subject to planning and structural surveys, bring much needed community facilities including a cafe, two new meeting rooms and a 1 to 1 room to the Centre of Cherry Hinton. Cherry Hinton residents will be able to use the new space as a venue for social, cultural and business events and meetings.

Come along and find out about this exciting new venture at the Festival Community Cafe on Sunday 15th September from 10am to 1pm or drop into the Library during Festival week.

Much of the funding is in place but Cherry Hinton has been asked to raise £50,000 towards the completion of the project.
